"But we're only taking a break," explain Fest Organizers, Jan and Jon Pendleton whose property and energies made the initial seasons possible. "Our own professional and personal lives have grown very full plus the volunteer assistance involved in the Fest has grown increasing absent. We have a wonderful abundance of musicians and other performing artists who are more than eager to participate but we need a volunteer workforce to put all of the pieces together."

Lake Wylie Music Fest is a water-based community festival that has involved a variety of local musicians, dancers, hand-drummers, and fire artistry all on a residential dock and waterfront staging. The audience attends by boat and watches, dances, plays, and sings-along from their vessels. The Fest was created on, as its organizers say "shoestrings and dreams."
